
What are the issues in Higher Education?

HARRASSMENT

45% of LGB pupils and 64% of trans pupils are bullied for being LGBT at school.

86% cent regularly hear phrases such as 'that's so gay'or 'you're so gay' in school.

1 in 10 (9%) of trans pupils are subjected to death threats at school.

Almost half never tell anyone about the bullying.



"Alarge group of boys ganged up on me and tried to rape me. They said it was OKand not rape because I am a freak and not real, and because I'm asking for it by being a 'freaky tranny" Ash, 18 (England)





HARRASSMENT

1 in 7 LGBT students (14%) have been the target of negative comments or conduct from a member of university staff in the last year because they are LGBT.

For black and minority ethnic students, the number is 1 in 4 (24%). For LGBT students who are disabled, 22% experienced this.


For Trans students, this was 1 in 3 (36%).

HARRASSMENT + BACKGROUND







MENTAL HEALTH

Rates of poor mental health are alarmingly high among LGBT young people, with trans pupils at particular risk. Over 4 in 5 trans pupils and 3 in 5 of non-trans LGBT pupils have deliberately harmed themselves at some point. This compares to NHS estimates that roughly 1 in 10 young people in general have deliberately harmed themselves.

Of these, more than 2 in 5 of trans pupils and one in 5 non-trans LGBT pupils have attempted to take their own life.

"I have looked into therapy that might make me straight and in the past have had suicidal thoughts because of my sexuality." Ahmed, 15 (England)



MENTAL HEALTH

42% of LGBT young people report mental health issues, compared to 29% of non-LGBT. LGBT people are similarly more likely to report experiences of selfharm and worryingly, are twice as likely to have contemplated suicide.

32% of those who have attended gender identity clinics waited between 1 and 3 years for an appointment, which leads to an increase in already disproportionately poor mental health.

BELONGING AND SUCESS

3 in 5 gay pupils who experience homophobic bullying say that this impacts on their school work. 1 in 6 say it's had a big effect on their school work. (2012)

One in three (32 per cent) gay pupils who experience homophobic bullying change their plans for future education because of it.

Significantly more likely to truant, and significantly more likely to be estranged from family

BELONGING AND SUCESS

Gay/lesbian and non -binary learners are more than twice as likely than average to say that they had considered leaving their education because of the way they were treated UNI





REASONS FOR DROPPING OUT











•DURING

APPLICATION Less accessible accommodation Little outreach work

AT SCHOOL

More likely to be estranged More likely to skip school More likely to achieve poor grades More likely to have poor mental health



•AT UNIVERSITY More likely to experience discrimination and violence More likely to drop out Less likely to achieve top grades
