

Group Development Annual Report 2020

This year has been like no other, and the way in which the Group Chairs and committees have dealt with the changes introduced due to COVID, including the introduction of online meetings and budget freezes on group spend, all whilst everyone's day jobs changed beyond recognition, has been remarkable.

The support and guidance provided by HELOA at a group and national level has proved invaluable this year as everyone has had to adapt to the huge changes in the sector during the pandemic. This can be seen in the increase across the majority of groups in terms of attendance at online meetings. This can be attributed to the platform being accessible for more members, without the need to travel to venues for group meetings, but also the support of groups in these uncertain times has been crucial.

Despite everything changing and even if certain events couldn't go ahead as originally planned, such as full day training events, groups were quick to implement changes to ensure the content wasn't lost, so some groups held training sessions over a number of weeks, some over a period of a week and others introduced additional virtual sessions to chat over lunch.

Although group spend was put on hold during the pandemic, due to a decrease in revenue from events, groups still managed to provide a great range of activity for members*, utilising expertise from across the membership and the wider sector, which can be seen in the group reports.

The innovative mentoring scheme created by the North West & Northern Ireland group and also adopted by the Scotland group is proving to be extremely beneficial for members. The aim is to roll the scheme out to all groups during 2021. NW & NI group have already worked with SW & SE, Anglia and Wales groups this year to help them to develop their own mentoring programmes going forward.

The training spreadsheet created by the training team, which contains all training information in one place, continues to be extremely useful for groups to consult before booking training for their group. In addition to this, I would like to solidify the approach needed when booking

training for groups, in terms of a flowchart of who to contact, e.g. training/partnership/finance etc. prior to making a booking and who makes the final decision on whether a booking can be made. This should make things easier and quicker for group chairs/VCs when considering potential training providers.

Myself and Dawn from the HELOA office are currently in discussions regarding the groups' needs in order to comply with GDPR. We are looking at various options at the moment and this will continue in more detail in 2021.

I would like to thank Ali Clark who stepped down from her group chair role during 2020. Ali made a fantastic impact on group activity in HELOA Scotland and she will be missed. Thank you for all your hard work and dedication. Thanks also to Grant Cullen for taking on the role of group chair in Scotland and Jen Barton for taking on the role of group chair in the North East, Yorkshire & the Humber. With limited time and having to undertake handovers online, it has certainly been a challenging start to their term!

I would also like to thank Rebecca Bowen for her continued support and hard work as group chair for Wales, again, she will be missed when she steps down in January. Special thanks to Rebecca for acting as our first group chair 'buddy' to HELOA Scotland's Grant. This worked well for both parties and allowed Grant to speak to a more experienced group chair on an informal basis when taking over the role. This will be something we will roll out to other groups as new group chairs come into post, to hopefully make the transition less daunting. I must also mention the hard work Rebecca and others put in to the Study in Wales virtual events this year. As Rebecca stands down after AGM, we look forward to welcoming her replacement Andy Jackson into the role in 2021.

Also, I would like to thank both Rebecca Oliver and Rachel Cox for continuing their term as group chair for longer than expected due to a lack of applications for the roles when advertised. It can always be a struggle to fill committee roles, for various reasons, but understandably this year may have put members off applying due to increases in workloads in the 'day job'. I am currently working with group chairs to come up with solutions of how to convert member engagement into applications. The introduction of name blind applications may help with some of the issues we have had in the past and it has already worked well for group committee roles for Wales and NW & NI where 3 applications were received for both, whereas the majority of roles last year were uncontested elections.

You have all shown tremendous resilience and dedication to ensure members have remained engaged and supported throughout this uncertain time. It is a pleasure to work with all of you and I look forward to 2021 and all that it may bring!
