

Group Development Annual Report 2019

Group level member engagement remained stable during 2019, with an overall slight increase in both attendance numbers in meetings and institutions in attendance.

The HELOA offer at group level continues to flourish. All groups offer a training day or conference, and there have been an array of interesting speakers and training sessions covering the breadth of the sector, alongside group meetings. The group reports provided showcase a great range of activity^{*}, utilising expertise from across the membership, the wider sector and beyond. Mention must go to the innovative mentoring scheme created by the North West & Northern Ireland group which is beginning to show great impact and is now going to be implemented across other groups.

Member voice is always at the heart of the work that goes on at group level and we are beginning to a higher demand for sessions that focus more on mental wellbeing and career development to compliment that more traditional sector related updates. This has been supported by the fantastic spreadsheet created by the training team which houses all training information in one place, allows for the easy exchange of information between groups and provides better synergy between groups and the training team.

The biggest challenge at group level remains converting member engagement into applications for group roles. 2019 has been a struggle in filling committee posts and those that have been filled have been mainly been through an uncontested election. A yearly audit has been done to confirm that roles for fit for purpose and I am in the process of re writing role descriptors to align the roles with specific skill development. I am very aware that there are many members out there on fixed term contracts with a desire to get involved with HELOA but are restricted due to the 3-year time constraint places on posts. At the November UKC my proposal to change this to make group committee posts (chair excluded) to a period of 'up to 3 years' was accepted. There is work still to be done however this will continue as a priority throughout 2020.

A large bulk of group spends are spent on hospitality and catering, whilst this may appear excessive on the surface it is fundamental in allowing groups to run quality events at no extra

costs to members. The new training spreadsheet has allowed groups to have better access to expertise from across the entire HELOA network resulting in lower speaker costs.

Finally, there are a number of thanks that I would like to give:

To Gail Alani, Elliott Newstead and Jonathan Atkinson who stepped down from group chair roles during 2019. All three of you made a fantastic impact on your group activity, thank you for all your hard work and dedication. Thank you also to the HELOA training team on supporting groups in the development of the training spreadsheet. This is an invaluable resource which allows for a more joined up approach to training and can ensure that HELOA funds are spent efficiently. The biggest thanks of all must got to the group chairs and committees; for putting yourself forward and being creative, knowledgeable and committed to your roles. For sharing best practice so that the wider membership can benefit, and for being tremendous advocates of HELOA

Challenges

We struggle with the engagement of all of our members. We have steady attendance, however only our annual training day in May pulls in a large attendance. Other meetings usually have attendance in the mid-20s which is low for a Group with over 200 members.

We have struggled this year with the Vice Chair (Membership and Communications) role. We had to send out the call multiple times before getting one nomination which went to an uncontested election. Since then the post-holder has changed roles and is no longer able to keep the position on. The role is now vacant and has been since September following unsuccessful calls for nominations.

Not a challenge, but just to note that London has a large number of regional positions. Therefore we get several members attending London meetings, even though their institutions are registered to a different HELOA Group. This explains the difference in institutions in the group and the number that attended the Training Day in May.

HELOA Scotland's Web Officer once again oversaw the production and mail out of the Open Day posters to key contacts in schools, libraries and Skills Development Scotland offices. In addition to being sent out to Scottish schools, schools in Northern Ireland and the North of England were also targeted.

Challenges

The challenges faced by HELOA Scotland over the past few years have been rectified. The Scottish UCAS events for 2020 have now been incorporated into the national registration process for UCAS events. It is hoped this will lead to a greater number of UK universities out-with Scotland attending these events.

In addition, the Chair has worked with Angie Hill of UCAS on making improvements, namely the layout of specific events in order to avoid congestion, and the updating of UCAS presentations to reflect the differences in the Scottish HE system.
