As shown, membership numbers have decreased compared with last year, reflecting member feedback and trends seen across other areas of HELOA, including Training. This reduction likely reflects the ongoing pressures facing the higher education sector, with many institutions reviewing budgets and limiting additional expenditure, including on professional memberships and development opportunities.

Despite these challenges, HELOA remains committed to supporting members through professional development, networking opportunities, and practical guidance. The Group Development report (4.3) highlights how actively engaged our members are, demonstrating the ongoing strength of and benefits provided by being part of the Association.

Following the departure of the previous Associate Member Representative, we were pleased to welcome James Kerr from the University of Buckingham to the role in early 2025. Since joining, he has worked to establish relationships with our associate members to understand their needs and help them make the most of their membership.

During 2025, we conducted the HELOA Membership Survey, which received 239 responses (a 3.4% increase on the previous survey). Members were invited to provide feedback on all areas of HELOA, with the opportunity to share additional comments through free text responses. Key findings, with a particular focus on membership, are summarised below:
