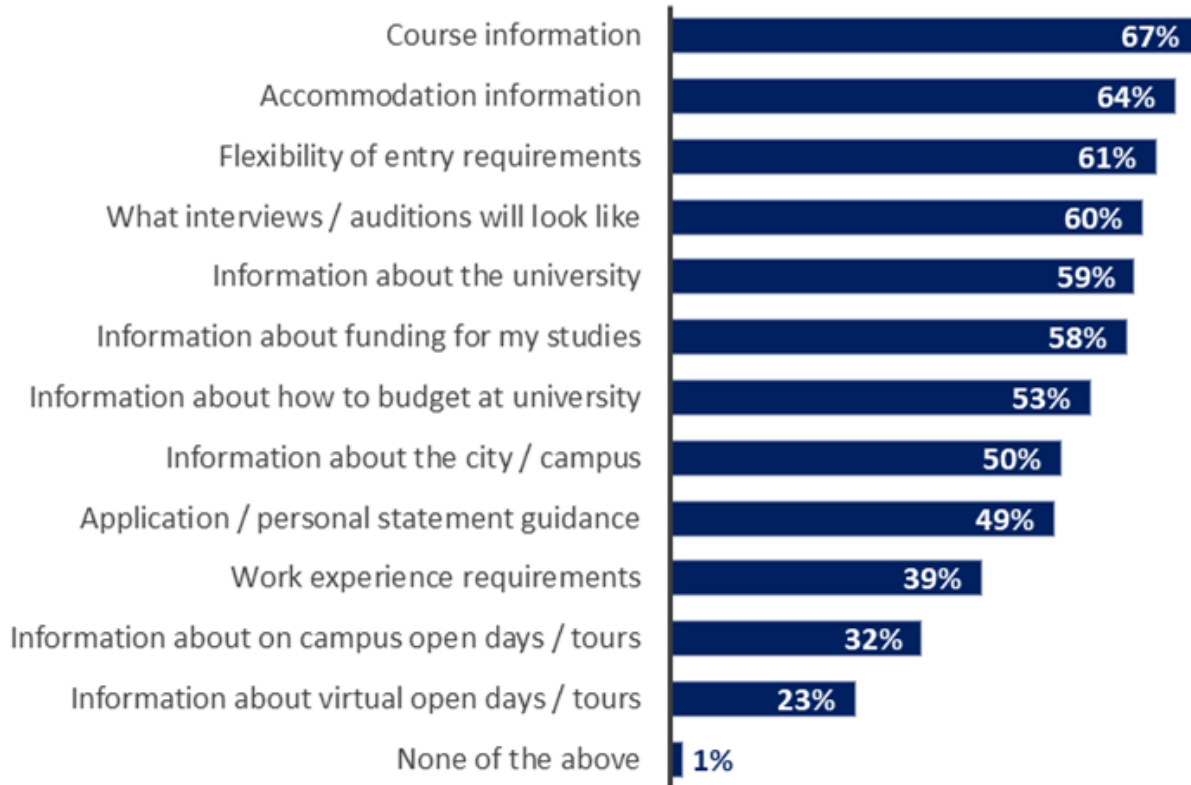

- 44% My future employability

# What help do applicants need?

- 72%**      **Include course essentials (uniforms, equipment etc) in tuition fees**
- 70%**      **Be upfront about any additional course costs (software, trips etc)**
- 69%**      **Help them find part time jobs or paid opportunities at university**
- 68%**      **Be upfront about other costs (utilities, societies etc)**
- 65%**      **Provide budgeting and cost-cutting information**

*No time to, I've seen the cities I'm applying to already*

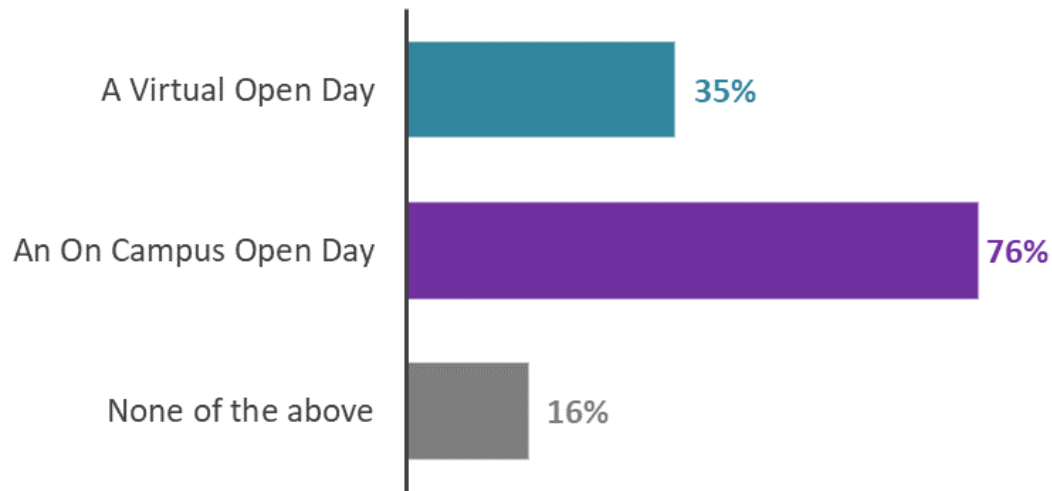
*Most of the university's doing my course are far (over 4 hours away) and I don't think visiting all of the options is necessary until I have chosen 5 which I will then visit to pick 1*

# Most had already visited a virtual or on campus open day

**90% found the virtual open day useful**

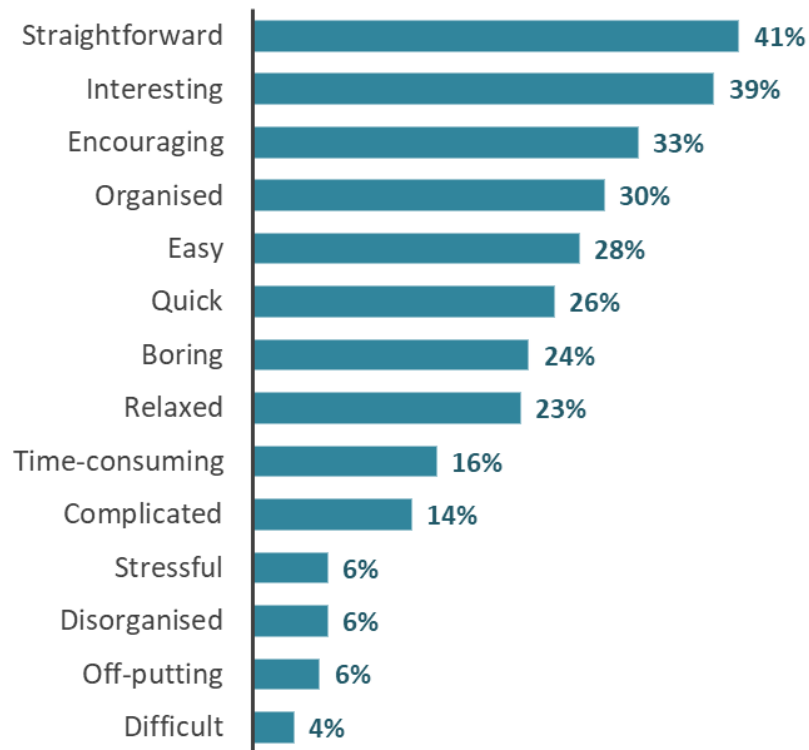
**98% found the on campus open day useful**

# Virtual Open Days



Virtual Open Days were most often described as

- **Straightforward (41%)**
- **Interesting (39%)**
- **Encouraging (33%)**

# The most important thing I want to find out at virtual open days is ...

**Course information** - more than half of all comments

Then

- Information about the university
- Application process/entry reqs
- Hearing from current students
- Accommodation info

*What the university has to offer, what the course i am applying for consists of*

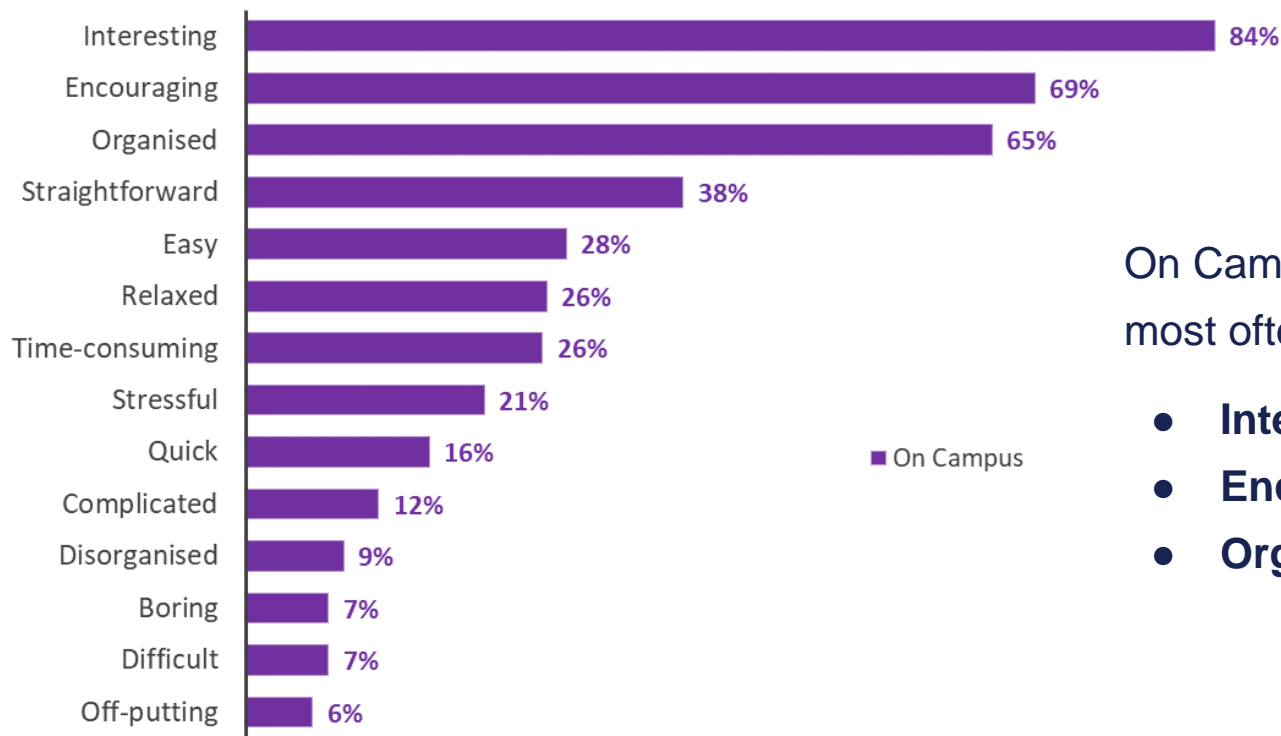
*What students think*

*The entry requirements and course content*

*Opportunities while at university and application process info*

*What the campus is like, and accommodation- everything else can be found on a website. The only reason I'd do virtual is because I can't access an irl open day so I need to irl experience*

# On Campus Open days

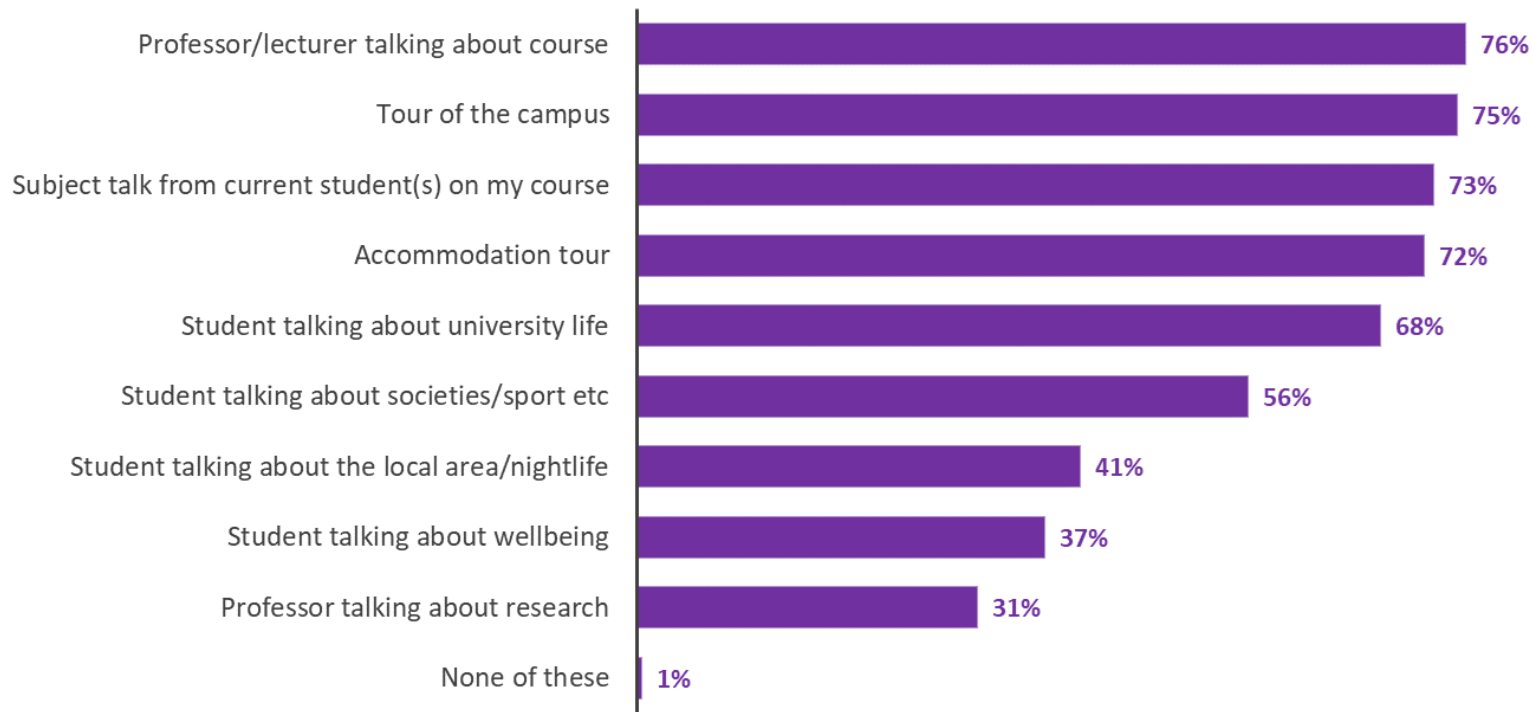


On Campus Open Days were most often described as

- **Interesting (84%)**
- **Encouraging (69%)**
- **Organised (65%)**

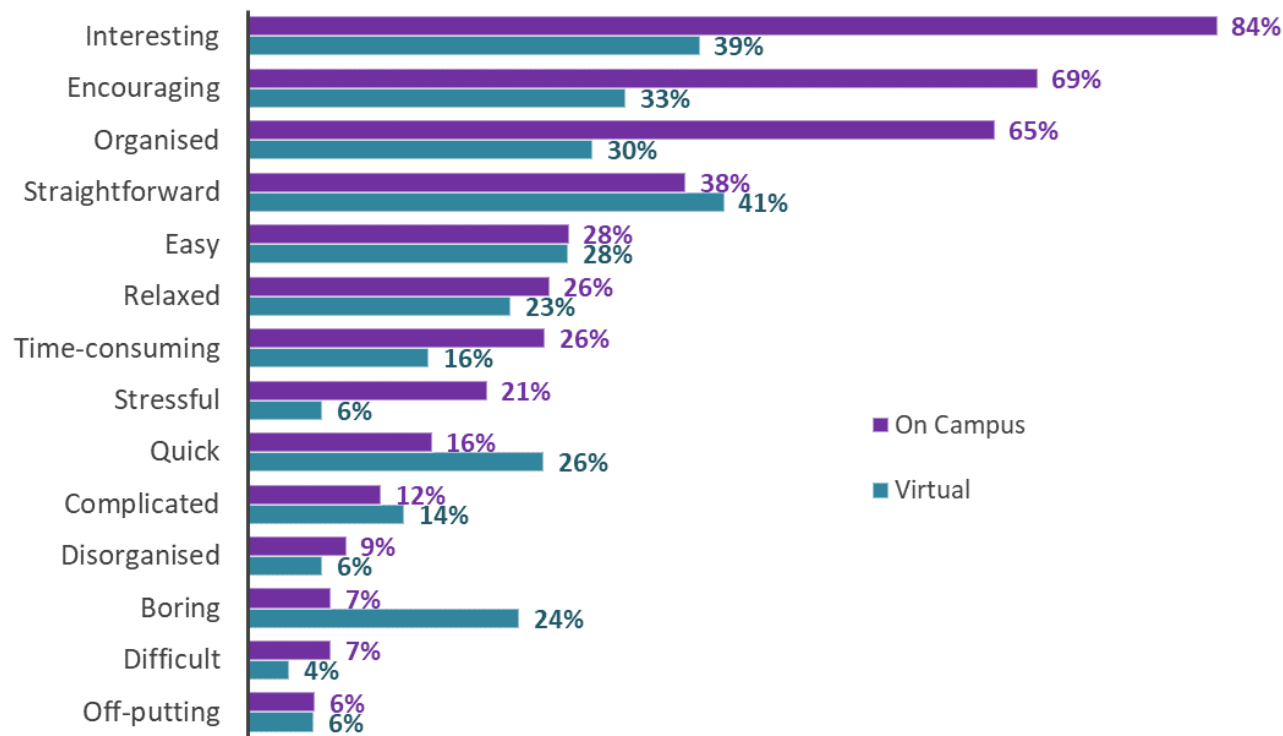

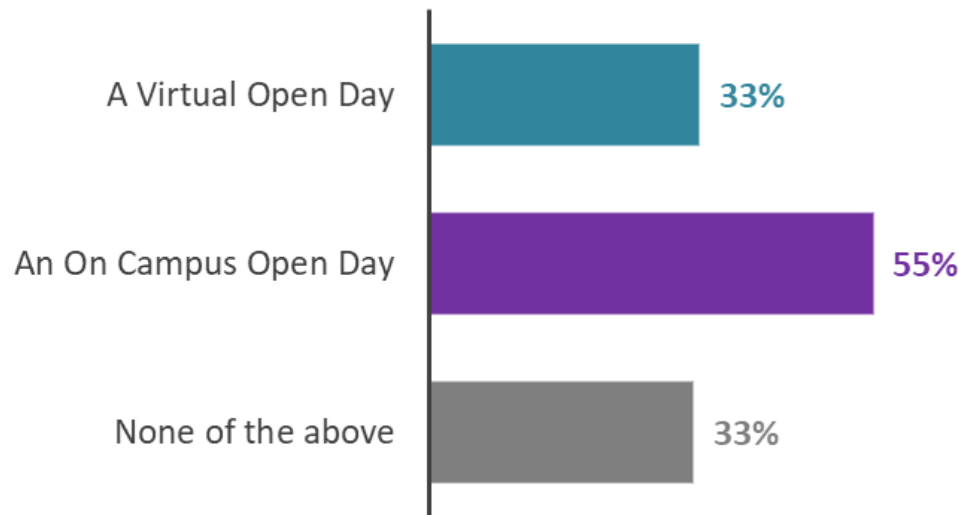
*Campus size, distance from

# More than half planned to attend On Campus Open Days in the future

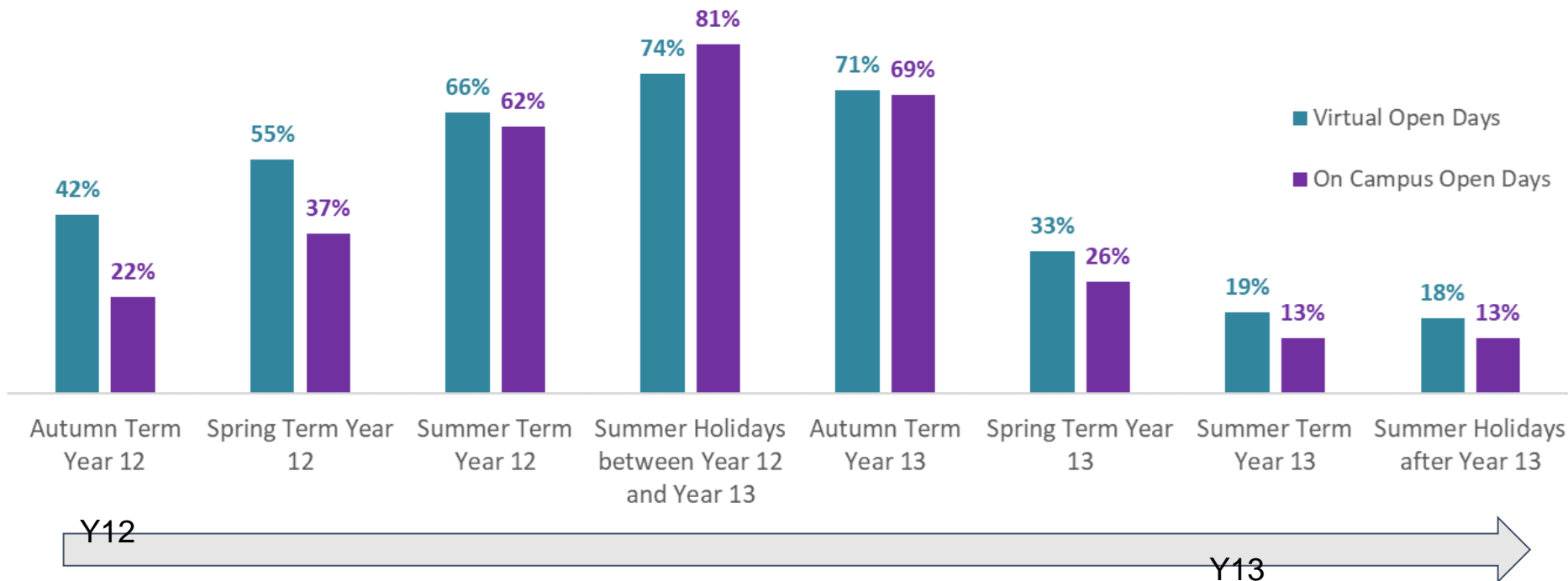
Which do you plan to attend?

**20%** wouldn't attend an **On Campus Open Day at all**

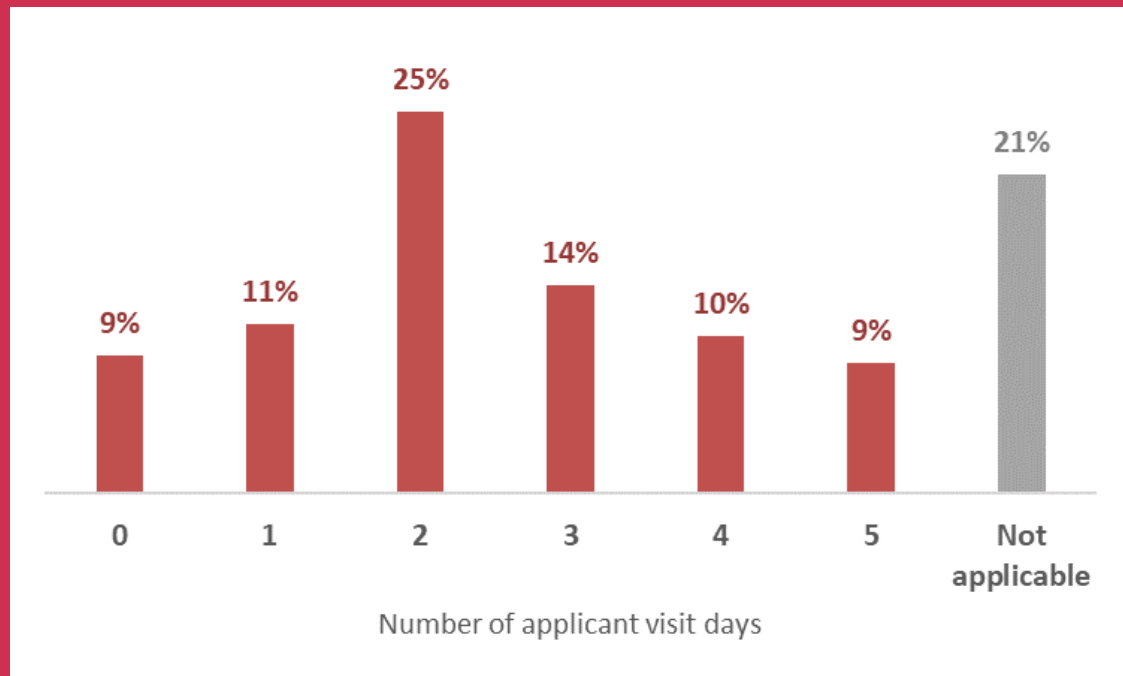
# When is the best time? (2023 entry)

# So what is stopping prospective students from going to applicant visit days?

- No need to
- Lack of awareness
- Expense





*If I have been offered a place at a good university, seeing the university in real life is not something which would make or break any decisions*

*I do not see any point*

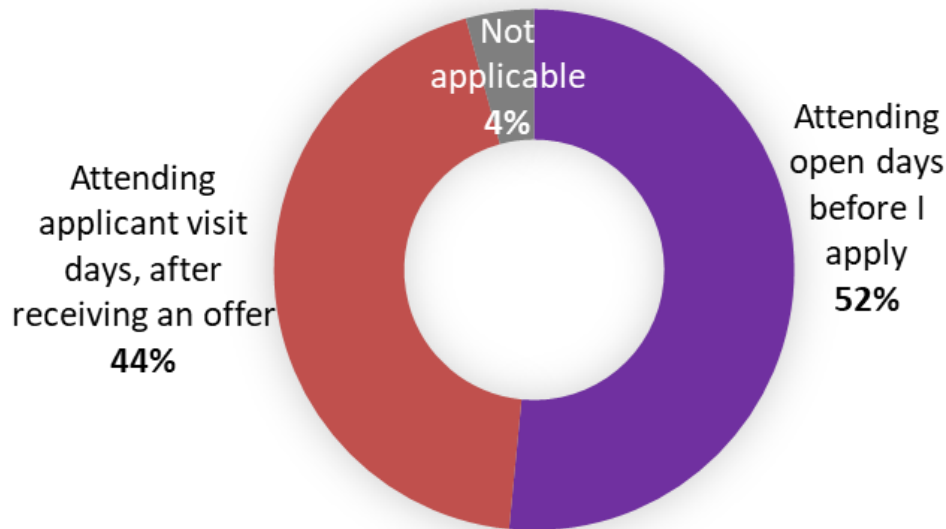
*Don't know anything about them and the universities I've applied to haven't told me about them*

*Main reasons for choosing a university is not based on its environment/location so no need for physical visit*

*Too expensive to travel there*

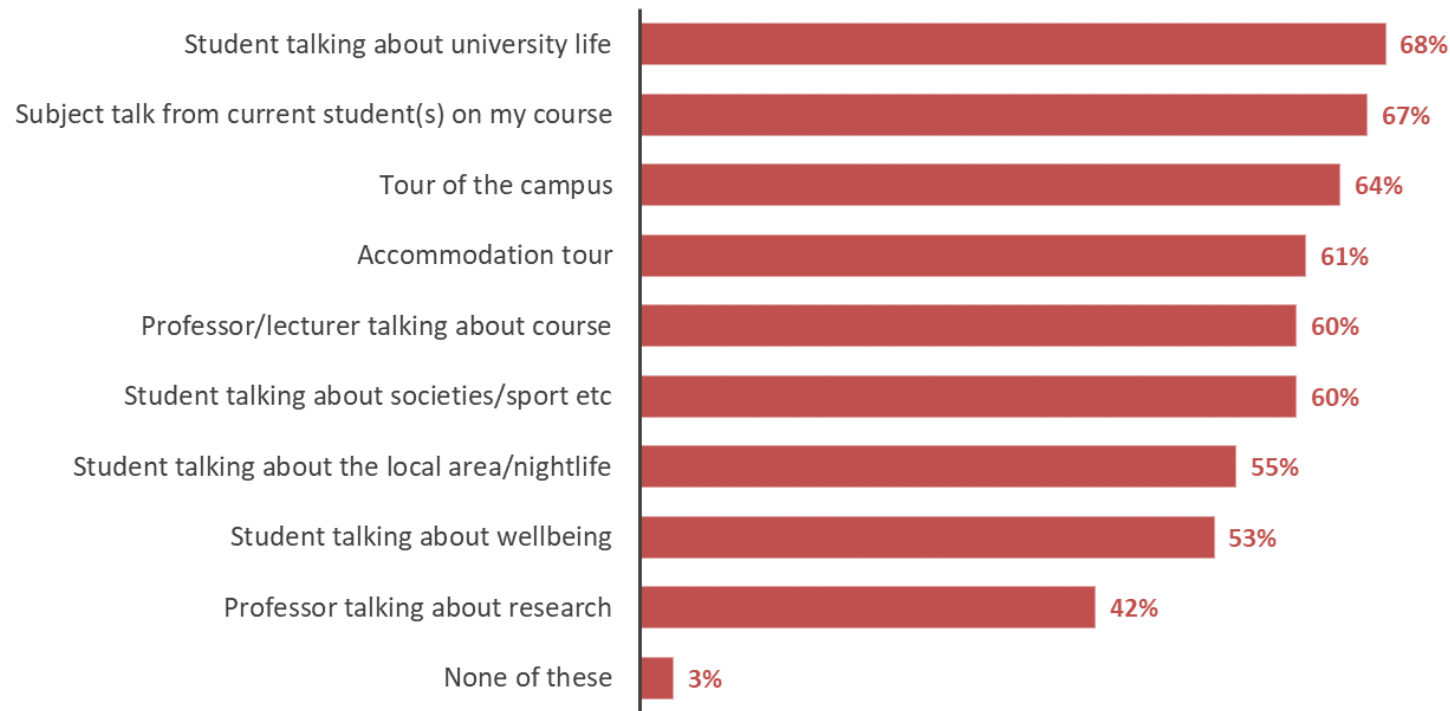
*I think I have attended sufficient open days at this point*

# The most important thing I want to find out at applicant visit days is ...

- Detailed course information, modules, structure
- Is it the right choice for me?  
What's it like?
- What are the people like?

*Is the course in this university the right one for me?*

*if I actually see myself studying there*

*A more personalised version of an open day, meeting potential classmates*

*What the vibe of the uni and my course is like in particular the personalities of the tutors and lecturers.*

*Gaining more information that may not have been specified on open days*

*How people that look like me are treated*

*How current students adapted to uni life at that course and how they are finding the content*

# Key Takeaways





- Events need to stand alone - each may be the only time a prospective student 'visits'
- They also need to be subtly different for those who do attend multiple events
- Virtual events - focus early in the decision cycle and provide course information
- General Open Days - showcase university, the atmosphere and orienting on campus
- Applicant Days - focus on detailed course information, people and ensuring applicants feel they will belong



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
