# 11.45am - 12:45pm - Neurodiversity- a primer with Richard Mills from AT Autism, University of Bath.

Richard is an Associate Consultant and Head of Research and Clinical Support, ATAutism, London. He is also a Research Fellow in the Dept of Psychology, University of Bath, visiting Professor, Taisho University, Tokyo, Japan, and Research Fellow at the Centre for Brain and Behaviour UNE, NSW, Australia. For over twenty years Richard was with the National Autistic Society UK, as Director of Services, and later Director of Research, a joint appointment with Research Autism, London.

His current research and clinical interests are in programme and service evaluation, autism and mental health, forensic issues, including cybercrime, and in behaviours of concern (the Synergy programme). He is a joint lead on the SPELL programme with the Tizard Centre at the University of Kent. He is an editor of 'Autism the international Journal for Research and practice', and 'Advances in Autism'. He is an expert member of the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE). He has authored numerous peer reviewed scientific articles.

This session will provide an overview of the concept of neurodiversity. Clarification of language and terminology and examination of the narrative. Whilst also providing descriptions of the different neurodivergent conditions.
