- > 37.7% of 18 year old applicants from England, Northern Ireland, and Wales received an offer with an unconditional component.
- > Over a quarter of applicants received a conditional unconditional offer.
- > 8.5% of offers made were conditional unconditional.
- > Applicants from advantaged backgrounds remain more likely to receive a conditional unconditional offer than applicants from disadvantaged backgrounds.
- > Arts applicants are most likely to receive a direct unconditional offer, as assessment of an applicant's portfolio can determine their suitability for their course.

Making applications

6.3 The Steering Group asks the Secretary of State for Education and Skills to set up a high-level implementation group as soon as possible to achieve post-qualification applications (PQA). The current system, relying on predicted grades, cannot be fair. It does not meet the Steering Group's recommended principles of fair admissions, since it is based on data which are not reliable, it is not transparent for applicants or institutions, and may present barriers to applicants who lack self-confidence.

A review of the benefits of Post-Qualification Application (PQA)

5.39 An area we want to examine further is whether a system of Post-Qualification Application (PQA) would promote fairer access. PQA involves students applying to higher education once their exam results are known, rather than relying on predicted grades. There continues to be considerable interest in such a system across the education sector.



PQA – the unassailable (?) logic

PQA

PQA – a solution looking for a problem?

- >92% get offers
- Three quarters get into first/firm choice
- Predicted grade system works for vast majority
- Conditional offers motivate students
 - (And it seems that '*unconditional*' offers de-motivate students)
- Applicants have plenty of time to make choices, visit universities, arrange accommodation, apply for loans
- Plenty of options if something goes wrong (Extra, Clearing, Adjustment)
- Schools/colleges free to concentrate on small number of students who find themselves in Clearing or want to change their minds



Main arguments against.....

Post Qualifications Applications & Admissions Transactions

- In numbers.....
 - C.400,000 school leavers needing post-results advice and guidance
 - Currently x5 applications each = 1.7million applications
 - (Reduce to two applications = 800,000 applications)
 - 400,000 students needing support around decisions
 - 400,000 student finance applications
 - 6-8 weeks between exam results published and start of university term
- And what about...
 - Open day visits
 - Accommodation
 - Pre-enrolment paperwork

And all in the school holidays!



Main arguments against.....

- Disadvantage for disadvantaged
- One big Clearing
- We already have PQA – it's called 'Clearing'
- University Planning/budgeting

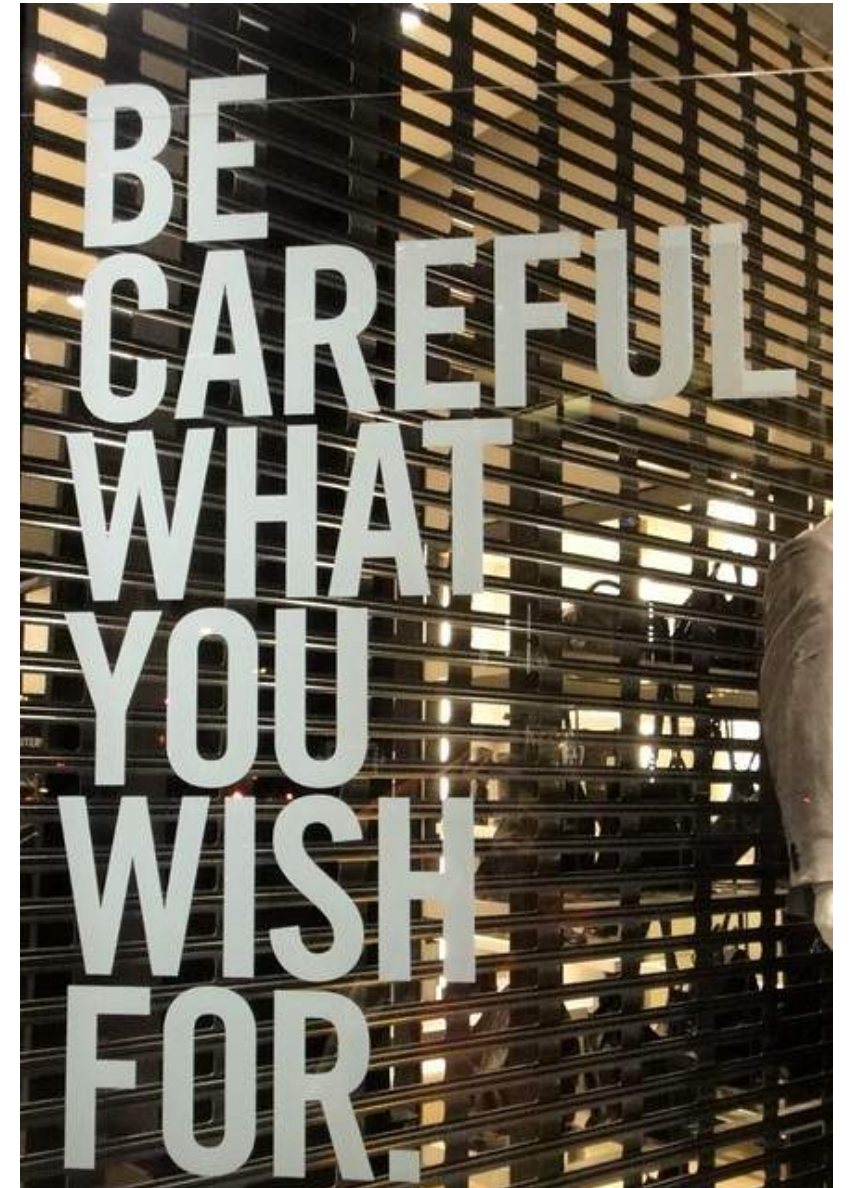


Could the wider system be improved?
