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

# **Community conversation**



#### What we are seeing on site

Since the beginning of September, The Student Room has attracted over 30 million pageviews across all areas of the site; with more than 18 million of those visiting the Study Help, University and University courses areas alone. "It's currently the 19th and I have made minimal progress on my UCAS statement. The reason I'm procrastinating is because I feel there is so much I can talk about regarding my background but little in terms of achievements or work experience, which I feel might make my application inadequate for universities?"

### Trends in topics of conversation on site currently includes:

- Seeking personal statement support
- Offer making queries and concerns
- Grade boundary worries
- Financial worries and money-management

"I've received an offer 16 points below the quoted offer level, It's not stated whether it's a contextual offer or not. I expected the text in the email to be generic copy/paste and the same for everyone, but some of it seemed specific to my situation. Could it be a low offer because I'm the right type of candidate for this uni/course?"



"Does having a learning disability affect your chances to get into the top ten Russell Groups? (I have ADHD and Dyslexia)"

"How can I get into a good university if I am retaking my A-levels in Summer 2023? If I reapply through my school I will have to use my old grades, with which it is highly unlikely that I will get into a good uni. So what is the point of retakes? Will I have to go through Clearing? How possible will it be for a Law course?"

"I'm not from an especially affluent background, more middle-class. I knew that all the prices at London universities would be a lot more, but I'm looking at some of these rent prices - almost everything is at £200+, some reaching £250 pw - and I wonder how it's even possible for people who live outside of London to afford this? Not to mention the cost of living with food and amenities prices already being extortionate in the capital."

"Do you guys think UCAS will use an Al detection tool to see if people have "plagiarised" using ChatGPT or other AI?"

### Worries of applicants

Sense of belonging is still high on the agenda for students, as meeting people and making friends is frequently mentioned as a top worry related to starting university.

Another common theme we see each year is that of financial concern and uncertainties with managing their finances at university.

With the cost-of-living crisis, changes to loan repayments and the ever-changing economic landscape in the United Kingdom students are calling out for new, targeted and relevant support and advice that goes above and beyond recipes for cheap meals.

#### How university Official Reps have been helping on The Student Room

Student reps provide peer to peer support and showcases universities student life offering.

Student reps can talk about own experiences and relate them to actionable points.

Provides valuable human to human interaction in a situation that the poster is finding stressful is so valuable.

Official Reps from CCCU, LJMU and LSBU all replied with tips and reassurance. Some of the reps were current nursing students.

"I'm aware that this is completely my fault for putting myself in this situation, but over the course of this year, i haven't been able to find work experience and I'm struggling with what i should do as I'm an applicant for 2024. it's something I'm really passionate about but i don't know how to express that in my personal statement without evidence of experience. I'm feeling very stressed out and guidance would be much appreciated."

"Don't stress you still have time to gain work experience before you submit your personal statement and start your Nursing course...However, work experience does not necessarily need to relate to your chosen degree as any work experience will be beneficial. For example, getting a part-time job in a supermarket or cafe can teach you basic communication skills that you'll use when you are a student nurse. It will also demonstrate you are a caring person who enjoys communicating with the public."



"I didn't quite get the grades I needed on results day and ended up applying through clearing - at the time I was really uncertain about what the future held for me! Fast forward 5 years and I'm in my 4th year of my MBBS degree and I couldn't be happier!..."

"I would say my best advice is, as I changed my mind a lot, that when it comes to deciding what you want to do go with your gut feeling. Striking a balance between what you are passionate about, what you excel in, and what will lead you down a decent career path is hard work. In all honesty you may get it wrong a few times - I still wonder about that!... Try to remember; you are capable, you will find your own path, and you have plenty of time to figure out some of the answers!"

"Starting university is such a big change, so my advice is to just take it one step at a time. It can be hard to get back into a routine, but I'm sure you'll find a new routine that works really well for you... I know it can be daunting and scary, but adjusting to uni life and finding a routine and making new friendships is a process!"










#### The Details That Matter... before applying to a university - 2024 entry




Q: What areas of university study/life would you consider essential to know about before applying to a university? (Multiple choice) (Base 2024 entry 227)









Half of 2024 entry would attend 2 or 3 applicant days but almost one in five didn't plan to attend any








Respondents who planned to move away for university were more likely than those attending university locally to have heard of the term offer-holder day (85% cf. 63%)

#### Top 5 useful elements of an applicant day




### When Peer to Peer support is needed

## Key takeaways



#### Key takeaways...

Universities are doing a lot of great things and students are getting the essentials – can more support be provided to alleviate concerns

There is scope to keep in touch after results day and provide more info that will help with settling in

Applicant days aren't a given most won't attend all five and lots won't attend any

Try to link applicants with others joining their course or current students to help them feel part of the community





#### Final tip: Use your Official Reps!
