

- 4 faculties



Support geared towards retention.



Getting Ready


- Recruitment Events

 - Formal Articulation direct applications
 - University Access Course






Getting In

- March 2016: Publication of Blueprint for Fairness
- MERs became a requirement
- Had been using contextual admissions before
- 'Guaranteed Offer'
- Opportunity to meet with Named Officer (pre-offer and offer stage)

Staying In

- Partnerships with Unite Foundation 3 Years accommodation scholarships
- 365 days accommodation in Halls deposit waiver/starter pack
- Partnership with the Robertson Trust Scholarships £3,400 living at home/£4,000 living away
- The McGlashan Trust PG Scholarships
- Priority for Discretionary Funding
- Transition Event for new Care Experienced applicants
- Digital Inclusion Laptop/Wi-Fi Grant
- Starter pack for new students




Getting On

Mentoring Programme

- Running since 2015
- One-to-one mentoring
- Originally supporting care experienced students
- Student asylum seekers included since 2016
- Instrumental to many students' progression and retention
 - A knowledgeable and friendly staff member as your 'go-to' person
 - Informal and friendly
 - Fortnightly meetings or as agreed between mentor and mentee (in-person and Zoom).
 - Meetings around University campus (cafés/office/library)
- Currently 130 Care Experienced/Asylum Seekers Mentoring Programme

Getting On

- Priority for residential and educational trips
- Guaranteed interview for paid student ambassador role
- Strathclyde Care Experience Society
- Strathclyde Cares Meetings
- Christmas Gifts/Christmas Dinner/Pantry
- Help with graduation costs
- Working with external organisations
 e.g. Articulate, Who Cares? Scotland
